People take refuge in the shadow of your wings.

you give them drink from your river of delights.
- ⁹For with you is the fountain of life;
in your light we see light.

Prayer

Psalm 103:8-12

- ⁸ the LORD is compassionate and gracious,
slow to anger, abounding in love.
- ⁹ He will not always accuse,
nor will he harbour his anger for ever;
- ¹⁰ he does not treat us as our sins deserve
or repay us according to our iniquities.
- ¹¹ For as high as the heavens are above the earth,
so great is his love for those who fear him;
- ¹² as far as the east is from the west,
so far has he removed our transgressions from us.

Spend time confessing to God those times where anger has got the better of you this week and you have not responded in the way you know that you should have. Then, trusting in His faithful salvation, let go of those sins thanks to his grace, and ask him to grow in you righteous anger about injustice and evil in this world, so that he can lead you in prayer in the areas that he lays on your heart.

Questions to ponder this week ...

1. In Psalm 109, David vents his anger strongly, asking God to punish those who have become his enemies and upset him. What do you recognise as your normal response when you are angry?

2. How could reflecting on 'why' you are angry assist you in becoming closer to the person God would have you be?
3. To what extent does anger go hand-in-hand with compassion and justice?
