Using Climate Stewards 360 Carbon tool we calculated our carbon footprint for 2022 and have donated £268.30 to off-set our annual

emissions.

## Between 1st January 2022 and 31st December 2022:

A total of 23,744 people visited our church giving an average carbon footprint of 565 gCO2 per person. The building was used for a total of 1,384 hours for an average footprint of 9.69 kgCO2 per hour.
