# Services

# **Morning Worship**

Our Sunday services are hybrid – you can attend in person or via Zoom. The service starts at 10.30am and incorporates sung worship, prayer, Bible readings and a sermon. We usually finish around 11.45am. Coffee is served before and after the service.

We celebrate Communion twice a month and mark festivals throughout the year. We hold regular all-age services when we can worship together – no matter our age!





We **live stream services** and **record the sermons**, which are then posted on YouTube. You may be seen on camera (back of head only) if seated on the front two rows. Remember, you can join a service with your video turned off if you prefer not to be seen on Zoom.

### **Junior Church**

Most Sundays, during morning worship at 10.30am, the children and young people start in the main service and then go out to the hall to enjoy activities exploring the Bible. The groups are facilitated by at least two leaders and offer something for all ages. There is space in the hall for carers to take their under-3s to play or in the foyer where you can also listen to the service.

# Gatherings

Being a church family means more than simply attending church on a Sunday morning. There are various opportunities to meet together for prayer and fellowship. These gatherings take place weekly, monthly or for a short series. The groups have various formats, from traditional 'house groups' to those that meet to eat together, or talk about books using the Big Church Read format. We also have three regular prayer meetings:

## Start the Week

We meet on Zoom every Monday for half an hour to pray for our community and the world. We follow the Northumbria Community's Liturgy.

# **CTT Prayer Breakfast**

Our Churches Together Prayer Breakfast meets in person on the first Saturday of the month at 8.30am. Tring churches take turns to host the meeting.

# **Baptism**

Baptism is a very special step on the journey of faith. It is a moment when God's presence and blessing meet us, and when we make a public declaration of our faith in Christ. In Baptist churches baptism normally takes place by full immersion in water as part of a gathered act of worship. It signifies that our lives are now focused on new life in Christ. It speaks of repentance and cleansing, of being united with Christ in his death and resurrection, and of witnessing to the call of God by sharing the faith journeys that have led people to be baptised as followers of Jesus Christ.

'Repent and be baptised every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ, so that your sins may be forgiven; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.' (Acts 2:38)

# **Bible Study Groups**

Because Christianity is not meant to be a spectator sport, small group Bible studies are not just valuable, but invaluable, moving us beyond being spectators at a Sunday service to engaging as active participants in a community dedicated to spiritual growth.

Small groups provide a platform for mutual care and encouragement and are at the heart of spiritual formation. They provide a comfortable and welcoming place to help new people to integrate into the church family and foster close relationships. They help cultivate leadership within the church, providing space for openness, listening, learning, accountability, prayer and growth. And for these reasons small groups are key to healthy church growth and individual discipleship.

At High Street Baptist Church we have 4 Bible study groups at various times in the week alongside various fellowship groups which are more social occasions. Please speak to one of the ministers for more information.

# Community



High Street Baptist Church has a prominent position on Tring High Street and is an active part of the community. Although a place of worship on Sunday mornings, we strongly believe that 'church' is not just for Sunday. We are really excited to be part of our local community and are concerned about making the Christian faith understandable and relevant in our homes, at our places of work or education and in our leisure times. We are active members of Churches Together in Tring and support a number of other local charities including DENS and CAP.


Churches Together in Tring is a network of churches. We work together to host a number of events during the year such as Lent Lunches, the Walk of Witness and events at the Tring Summer Carnival. *Comment* is the magazine of the Churches in Tring, with ten editions each year.





**DENS** is to be the first port of call for people in Dacorum who are facing homelessness, poverty and social exclusion; to support and empower them to take the next positive step in their lives. They provide temporary and short-term accommodation, and access to emergency food and provisions.

Christians Against Poverty (CAP) provides debt help and local community groups across the UK. Their free services provide practical and emotional support and show people that there is always hope. Northchurch Baptist Church is partnered with CAP and runs money management courses and offers support.

# **Baby group and Tots**

We have a versatile space at High Street Baptist Church. We offer midweek groups for babies and pre-schoolers. Every Tuesday from 10.30am to 12 Noon we hold a group for new-born babies and non-movers. A space for new parents to chat, meet people and find support. Every Wednesday (during term time) from 9.30am to 11.30am our Tots group offers a large play area and craft room.





# **Youth Group**

Monday nights (during term time) our Youth Group meet for a varied programme of social events, games, baking, discussion group and more! The group is for young people aged 11 to 16 years.

# **Being Baptist**

High Street Baptist Church is a member of the Baptist Union of Great Britain and we align ourselves with the Christian beliefs set out in the Baptist Union Declaration of Principle.

Being Baptist means we are an independent church, self-governing and self-financing, but we work interdependently with other 'likeminded' churches to fulfil our individual and common purposes.

Our purpose as outlined in our governing document (constitution) is:

'The principal Purpose of the Church

# **Declaration of Principle**

- 1. That our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, God manifest in the flesh, is the sole and absolute authority in all matters pertaining to faith and practice, as revealed in the holy Scriptures, and that each church has liberty, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, to interpret and administer his laws.
- 2. That Christian baptism is the immersion in water into the Name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, of those who have professed repentance towards God and faith in our Lord Jesus Christ who 'died for our sins according to the Scriptures; was buried, and rose again the third day'.
- 3. That it is the duty of every disciple to bear personal witness to the gospel of Jesus Christ, and to take part in the evangelisation of the world.

is the advancement of the Christian faith according to the principles of the Baptist denomination. The Church may also advance education and carry out other charitable purposes in the United Kingdom and/or other parts of the world.'

The constitution outlines the way we govern ourselves. This is not imposed upon us, but provides guidelines which we have mutually agreed upon, and which offer us not just compliance with charity law but also accountability and practical value.

As a church together we seek to discern the mind of Christ in all aspects of church life, which is usually done through our Church Members' Meetings (conducted in-person and online). While all are welcome to attend these meetings, only members may vote on proposals.

The day-to-day tasks and management of the church is the responsibility of the leadership team which consist of: the ministers, who are called by the membership, and deacons, who are elected from within the membership. (Our deacons are our charity trustees and have a legal responsibility under charity law.)

# Membership



## Why become a member?

We welcome all to worship with us and learn together about how to be followers of Jesus. It has always been a biblical principle that Christians should be an active part of a fellowship of believers. If you become a member of our church you commit yourself to being a part of the Baptist church here in Tring, sharing and engaging in our common aims and beliefs.

### Who can become a member?

While baptism by full immersion is the traditional entry into membership of Baptist churches, we have 'open membership' whereby persons may be accepted on their own public profession of faith.

### What are my rights and privileges as a member?

As a member you can play a full part in deciding what the church does, what are its priorities, how its money is spent, and who are chosen to be the ministers and deacons. As per our vision for GROWTH one of our important values is mutual care and support for one another in our church family.

# What are my responsibilities as a member?

It is important to remember that as a member you have responsibilities, as well as rights! Our constitution explains these responsibilities in the following words:

- attending worship and participating in Church Activities;
- personal prayer and Bible study;
- participation at the Communion of the Lord's Supper as a privilege and a priority;
- helping the Church whenever possible by using gifts and abilities to advance the
   Purpose of the Church through its Activities;
- attending and participating in Church Members' Meetings;
- giving regular financial support to the Church in proportion to personal resources and circumstances;
- upholding Christian values.

### How do I become a member?

The first step is to speak with the ministers or Church Secretary who will explain more and answer any questions. If you want to proceed you will be interviewed by two members who will then commend you for membership at the next church meeting. You will be formally accepted into membership at the next communion service.

At High Street Baptist Church we offer and encourage the opportunity for all parents to mark the birth of a child in a service of worship, and we believe that this provides an ideal opportunity to give thanks for this new life and to commit as parent/parents to bringing up this child to the best of your ability and in the teachings of the Christian faith. The act of dedication also gives the local church an opportunity to offer their support and prayer for you.

### **Funerals**

At High Street Baptist Church we are well aware that every family experiences the trauma of bereavement from time to time. We have many years' experience of supporting people through this most difficult of life's events. Our ministers are always available to help plan and conduct a funeral or thanksgiving service and our pastoral team seek to stand with those experiencing loss.



# **Eco Church**



At High Street Baptist Church we do not see creation care as simply an add-on to the usual 'business' of being church. As Christians we believe that God is our Creator. He not only created the world that we might live in it, he gave us stewardship of it.

# Global Mission






As a church we aim to support global mission in a variety of ways. Support also means giving financially, keeping in touch and praying for particular individuals and situations. As well as collecting for Christian Aid at our Lent Lunches, run as part of the Churches Together annual activity, we have links with agencies and people working overseas.

Every two months we produce a Spotlight on World Mission to draw attention to global issues, such as Fairtrade, and share information about the partners we support.

### Musalaha

We currently have links with Musalaha, an organisation whose name means 'reconciliation' in Arabic. Musalaha promotes reconciliation between Israelis and Palestinians by building grassroots relationships. We hope High Street and Musalaha will benefit each other; our Growth strategy has echoes of their reconciliation work.

If you pay tax, please complete the form overleaf so we can reclaim it via Gift Aid.

**Gift Aid** is a government scheme which allows High Street Baptist Church to reclaim the tax you have already paid on the money you give in your offering or donation. Gift Aid increases the value of your offering. For every £1 you give, we can claim 25%, that means your £1 gift becomes £1.25. Anyone who pays Income Tax or Capital Gains Tax can give through Gift Aid. For us to claim Gift Aid you need to complete a Gift Aid Declaration Form. You can cancel your Gift Aid Declaration at any time.

# Privacy statement 🛍

Under Data Protection legislation the Charity Trustees of High Street Baptist Church are required to include a Data Controller and it is the Church Secretary who acts as our Data Protection Officer. We collect information to enable the church to keep in touch with you and to provide pastoral support as appropriate.

Data Protection legislation allows us to process your information as we regard it as being in the church's legitimate interest. Your name and contact details will be entered into our church database which is password protected and is accessed only by the Ministers, Church Officers and Office Manager. Your contact details will be removed from the database once you are no longer a member of the church – unless you ask to remain as one of our 'church friends'.

In addition, we produce a **Church Directory** which is distributed by email to all Church Members and regular members of the congregation (and in hard copy as appropriate). A copy is also kept in the church office. We do not give copies of the Church Directory to anyone else. If you are happy for your details to be included please indicate where asked to do so overleaf. You can ask for your details to be removed at any time by contacting admin@tringbaptistchurch.org.uk.

To enable us to provide adequate pastoral support to you and your family, one of the Ministers may record information which may be regarded as sensitive. This information will be stored (in password protected documents) on the church computer but the password will only be known by the Ministers. This information will NOT be disclosed to anyone else without your consent. You have the right to ask to see any information we hold about you (including the pastoral support information) by submitting a 'Subject Access Request' to the Church Secretary. You also have the right to ask for information which you believe to be incorrect to be rectified.

If you are concerned about the way your information is being handled please speak to our Data Protection Officer. If you are still unhappy you have the right to complain to the Information Commissioner's Office.

Finally, we would like to obtain your permission to use images for sharing activity going on in the church and to promote events. To give your consent to this, please tick the relevant box overleaf. Again, you are able to withdraw this consent at anytime by contacting admin@tringbaptistchurch.org.uk.
